7. COMMENTS/ISSUES

Alliance High School operates two day programs and one night program on two campuses. As an in-district alternative, the school primarily serves students who are credit and/or skill deficient. In addition to vocational-technical and credit-recovery courses, college preparation courses are available. Staff uses small individualized and group classes, social supports, and college and career experiences to support students in meeting all requirements for a standard diploma. Most students register some time during their third year of high school and on average are between 6 to 12 credits deficient. Rooms shown are those at the Meek site.

As of 2018-19, The Oregon Department of Education has identified this School as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement School.
