#### 7. COMMENTS/ISSUES

Effective 2018-19, Beverly Cleary had a boundary change, resulting in some K-4 students being reassigned to Irvington and Rose City Park.

Effective 2018-19, Roseway Heights reconfigured from a K-8 to a Middle School, with 6-8 students coming from Roseway Heights, Scott, Lee, and Vestal. Scott, Lee, and Vestal became K-5's. Rose City Park opened as a new elementary school, with K-5 students coming from Roseway Heights, including the Vietnamese Immersion Program. Two boundary changes were made which redirected some Rose City Park students to Lee and some Lee students to Rose City Park.
