Building hours

There is student supervision between 8:00 AM through 3:15 daily. Beyond those hours, the school assumes responsibility only for those students under structured staff supervision. Examples of this include, but are not limited to, drama rehearsals and preparation, sports practices and games, supervised club activities. Please encourage your student(s) to come home after school is over unless he/she is involved in a staff supervised activity.

Locked Doors

Following guidance from our Portland Police Bureau partners, we keep most doors locked during the school day. For example, we keep the Franklin and Powell side doors locked after 8:45 as well as the main back door to the east wing. However, we keep the far right hand main entrance door unlocked all day.

School Closings/Inclement Weather

In the event of a school closing due to inclement weather or building technicalities, tune into the local television and/or radio stations for up to the minute announcements. School closings may not include all schools or areas of Portland. Listen or watch carefully.

PPS Holidays may not reflect the same holiday calendar as State or Federal employees. In addition, Cleveland's calendar of grading periods may not coincide with that of surrounding middle, K-8, or elementary school grading calendars. A PPS calendar and a Cleveland calendar are included to help you stay on track.

Medication at School/Immunizations

Parents are encouraged to administer medications to their students at home. If medication needs to be administered during the school day, parents are responsible for bringing the medication to the school nurse in the Teen Health Center and completing the necessary paper work with the staff there. Written instructions are required. Verbal requests of any sort cannot be accepted. Students should neither carry medication nor self-administer any kind of medication at school. Under no circumstances should any student ever share his/her medication with another student. This would constitute a violation of the PPS Drug & Alcohol policy and would result in disciplinary consequences.

Immunizations must be current to avoid exclusion from school. Immunization records are kept and cleared with the school nurse in room 163. You may call 503 988-3350 and ask for Nurse Kathy Beckwith if you have questions.

Emergency Drills

We conduct monthly fire drills, two earthquake drills and practice Lock In and Lock Out procedures every year. Please remind your student(s) how important it is for students to quietly comply with all staff directions.

Should we ever have a need to evacuate the building, our gathering spot is across the street in Powell Park.

Elevator Use

If, for any reason, a student is unable to access the stairs, we will issue an elevator card for the duration of the need. Cards are available in the main office. There is a replacement cost of \$10.00 for lost cards. Unauthorized use of the elevator is not permitted.

ID Cards/Tri Met Bus Pass

School identification is required of all students and is issued at fall registration. For the second year, a TriMet logo will be on the ID card. This enables students to ride TriMet for free. Students who miss registration must wait until September 16th when LifeTouch returns to get their ID card. In the meantime to check out textbooks, you will need to show your current schedule to the book room clerk. ID cards are required to check out textbooks and library books and to gain entrance into dances and athletic events. No ID, no entrance. If an ID card is lost, there are replacement costs. First time = \$5.00, second time = \$50.00. There is no TriMet logo for the third lost card replacement.

Fines and Fees

Please encourage your student(s) to keep current on any fines for late books or fees for lost or stolen books or charges for missing sports equipment or uniforms. Students will not be issued a locker if they have any unpaid fees or fines.

Valuable Property

Lockers are not secure. **Lockers are not secure.** Students are repeatedly reminded not to leave valuable items or money in their lockers. Cleveland High School is not responsible for lost or stolen personal property on school grounds. We encourage students to complete a stolen property report when an item is believed to be stolen, and we make efforts to retrieve stolen item whenever feasible. However, lockers are not secure.

Messages to students

Please call the main office if you have an **urgent** message you need your student to receive. We will see that your student gets that message. Please avoid calling your student during class time. It is disruptive to the learning environment, and we have a NO cell phone use during class policy, which has consequences for violations. Thank you for helping maintain the best educational environment possible in today's electronic age!

Electronics at school

We recognize that we live in the age of electronics, with many students having the use of cell phones and MP3s and iPods. We want to allow the proper use of these. Cleveland has a policy of NO cell phone use during class. This includes sending and receiving text messages. There are consequences for violating this policy, which begin with a request to put the phone away. Frequent violations will result in school discipline and could ultimately end with the requirement that the phone stay home. MP3 and iPod use should only occur during non class times unless a teacher has given permission, which sometimes occurs in study halls. Please discuss this policy with your student.

Electronics devices are the favorite targets of theft, and are brought at students' own risk. Remember, lockers are not secure.

Visitors and Guests

PPS has a no student visitor policy. The only exceptions to this are students on a cultural exchange, like the Dutch students we hosted one year, and eighth grade students on an approved shadow. These are scheduled through the Special Projects Coordinator's office.

Communication

Good communication with our families is important to us. If you have a concern regarding your student's academics, please contact the teacher either by leaving a message at the school or through email. Teachers check their email daily. The 2009-2010 email list is included. A current staff email list can always be found on the website: www.clevelandwarriors.org. Counselors are always a good resource and can also be reached by phone or email.

Attendance

The single most important step for every student to be successful in school is simply to be present in every class every day. Cleveland uses the PPS autodialer system which calls the main home number every time there is an absence. When questioned by you, your student may protest, "But I was there. It's just a mistake." Please follow up with us nevertheless, as it is our experience that 9/10 the autodialer was reporting correct absences. Early intervention is critical.

When your student must be absent for an illness, medical or dental appointment, or family emergency, you need to write a note within three days of the absence to have it be excused. We will issue an admit slip for teachers to initial. An excused absence enables your student to have make-up work whereas an unexcused absence does not. You can also call to excuse an absence. Students need to talk with their teachers to see what work needs to be made up after an excused absence.

Appointments During the Day

When an appointment is unavoidable during the school day, please write a note with the time your student needs to be released. Your student will show this to his/her teacher, and then the Main Office Staff where he/she will sign out. Your student should sign back in upon returning during the same school day. That note can also serve to obtain an admit slip the next day for the periods missed.

Prearranged Absence

If you know that you will be taking your student on a trip or your student will be gone from school for more than two days, you must write a note to the attendance secretary to that effect. This will generate our (blue) prearranged absence form which your student will take to his/her teachers so they may be aware of the absence and give work to do while the student is away from school. We will make a copy of the completed form for our records.

Ten Day Withdrawal

Any student who is absent from Cleveland for 10 consecutive school days will be withdrawn. Please call one of the vice principals if you have questions about this.

Tardiness

Teachers typically begin class with a warm up activity while they take attendance. Students need to be present on time to earn credit for this. Chronic tardiness will affect a student's grade as these warm up activities cannot be made up.

Homework Policy

There is always something a student should do. Homework is a natural extension of the classroom. The amount of homework will vary according to subject and by what is accomplished in a classroom on a specific day. We highly encourage parents to be involved in this process by providing encouragement, support, and by checking in with your student to see if assignments are complete and turned in. You could also set up an email correspondence on a specific day of the week, like Thursday or Friday, to check in with your student's teachers.

Academic Honesty

Cleveland High School has high standards for student behavior and cheating and plagiarism are not tolerated. Teachers will contact parents/guardians, as well as write a referral for disciplinary action. Plagiarism and cheating can have a detrimental effect on a student's course grade. The document/ test/ work sheet or paper will be given a grade of 0/F.

Building Screening Committee & 504 Plan Meeting

Our goal is to provide full educational opportunities to all students with disabilities. If you have reason to believe that your student might qualify for specially designed instruction due to a disability, you can call and request a BSC meeting. You can speak with your student's counselor or vice Principal Leslie Butterfield. These meetings are held every other Tuesday afternoon from 3:30-4:30. Our school psychologist will review your student's Cumulative file in advance of the meeting. A vice principal, the school psychologist, a special education teacher, your student's counselor and some of your student's teachers will be there. In addition, parent(s) and your student will attend the meeting. Whether or not to go forward with special education testing and possible placement will be a team decision.

If your student has a medical or other diagnosis or a temporary medical condition which you feel has a negative impact on your student's ability to have equal access to education, you can call the school and request a 504 Plan meeting. These meetings are also held on Tuesdays and function

much the same as BSC meetings. The Team decision is whether or not to write a 504 Plan with accommodations which level the playing field.

Student Dress

While dress and grooming are basically the individual responsibility of students and parents, there are limitations as described in the PPS policy, which addresses modesty and safety. Nothing gang related or alcohol or drug related may be worn. Nor can students wear clothing with foul, obscene or suggestive language. In addition, no halter tops, strapless tops, tube tops, backless clothing, spaghetti straps or muscle shirts are appropriate for school attire. Health and safety issues dictate that students cannot be barefoot.

Student Discipline

Cleveland follows the PPS policies and practices regarding all forms of discipline. Corrective action may vary from a conference with the student to formal suspension or expulsion from school. Students may face different discipline levels for the same event based on past discipline experiences and student history.

When a teacher writes a discipline referral, a copy is mailed home after the vice principal has met with the student. These documents are filed in the VP offices until graduation, and then they are shredded. The vice principals are always happy to answer any questions that might follow the receipt of a referral.

Substance Abuse

Cleveland staff follows the disciplinary steps as determined by PPS Student Conduct policy whenever we find a student under the influence of alcohol and other drugs. This is a zero tolerance policy. There are prescribed consequences.

Level A - first time use of or presence during the use of alcohol and other drugs:

- Chemical Insight Class facilitated by PPS Staff
- 28 calendar ban from participation in any competitions if on an athletic team or club sport
- May include up to 5 day suspension from school
- May include up to 8 hours of community service

Level B – second time use or presence during the use of drugs or alcohol within three years OR sale or transfer of drugs or alcohol the first time:

- Expulsion. This may be delayed if the student is accepted into a school-approved alternative program or treatment service which addresses the student's alcohol and other drug issues.
- Exclusion from district schools and activities

Level C – third time use of presence during the use of alcohol and other drugs OR second time sale or transfer:

- Expulsion

Note: Student athletes are held to the zero tolerance alcohol and other drugs policy 24/7 during their sports season.

Commencement disqualification: Seniors will be disqualified from participation in Commencement exercises and related activities if within 60 days of the last senior school day they are found to be in violation of the District Drug & Alcohol policy or any other violation resulting in suspension. This includes, but is not limited to, fighting, theft, and vandalism, including senior pranks. The Cleveland administration is consistent in notifying seniors about this consequence every year, beginning in September.

Opportunities for Parent Involvement

We consider our parents one of greatest assets as we have a very supportive parent community. We actively encourage parent involvement and Cleveland has many opportunities for parents/guardians to become involved.

Site Council: This is a volunteer advisory group of teachers, support staff, students, administration, community partners and parents. Parent input on this committee helps shape the direction of academics and programs for CHS. This group meets once a month on Tuesday afternoons at 3:30.

PTA: This parent organization supports over 25 different committees that help Cleveland run. From registration to the senior all night party, they do it all for CHS. A major fundraising auction and dinner event is held each spring. This group meets once a month with the principal Paul Cook, as well as meetings of subcommittees throughout the year.

The Boosters: This group of volunteers and parents focuses on school and club sports support. This group meets once a month with the Athletic Director and a vice principal. In addition, subcommittees meet as needed for specific activities and fundraisers. The Boosters provide money for uniforms, trips, scholarships, and other sports related activities.

The Cleveland Foundation: This is the only group that can raise funds to support teaching and other staff positions that otherwise might be reduced or eliminated. This group meets once a month on Monday evenings with the Special Projects Coordinator and a vice principal.

POPS (Parents of Performing arts Students): This group supports Choir, Band, Orchestra and Drama. The Cleveland POPS is involved in "**behind the scenes**" work for the Performing Arts department, including providing meals for late rehearsals, selling tickets and concessions at the various on-site performances, and general program support. Parent involvement in these activities is critical to the success of the performers and our programs.

Cleveland Community Field Project: This is a committee dedicated to raise money to renovate the field complex. Thus far, they have raised money to pay for the artificial field turf and the resurfacing of the track. Current efforts are to complete the renovation with covered bleachers, new storage and concession areas and finally, landscaping.

Commerce Cleveland Alumni Association: The Cleveland-Commerce High School Alumni Association (CCHSAA) serves the graduated communities of both Cleveland High School and its previous incarnation, the Clinton Kelley High School of Commerce. The Alumni Association helps coordinate class reunions, alumni events and school fundraisers. New members are desired and welcomed.
