## Walking and Biking in Fall Rainy Weather:

The rain has arrived. Children walking and biking to school must be prepared. A warm breathable waterproof or water resistant coat or jacket is best for the rainy weather. A nice poncho also works really well on rainy days. You may also consider wearing a shower cap under your bike helmet. Consider bike fenders to keep water and mud from splashing on you. When biking in wet weather ride slower and practice braking when first becoming accustomed to wet pavement. Pump your brakes gently while going down hills to reduce the bike speed. Puddles can be surprisingly deep, and conceal glass and bumpy things, so avoid them. Wet leaves are treacherous. Try to avoid riding through them, and especially avoid turning sharply on them, to avoid skidding through a messy puddle. You may want to bring a plastic bag to cover your seat when your bike is parked in the rain.

**PPS Hosts Information Session on School Buildings:**

On Tuesday, Dec. 6, PPS hosts “Buildings & Learning 101: A background briefing for people who care about Portland Schools,” from 7-9 p.m. at Benson High School, 546 N.E. 12th Ave.

Attendees will learn about best practices for school facilities nationwide and how they pertain to PPS schools. PPS Chief Operating Officer C.J. Sylvester and Facilities Director Tony Magliano will offer an illustrated presentation, addressing issues such as:

- What are the basic requirements for good school buildings?
- What building improvements are needed to support new teaching and learning methods and technologies?
- What have studies and assessments told us about the condition of PPS buildings?
- What are the options for funding school capital improvements?

A question-and-answer period will follow.

The meeting is part of the school district’s continuing effort to educate Portlanders on the state of PPS buildings and to engage the community in identifying needed upgrades and how to pay for them.

**District News: Inclement Weather**

Winter weather is on the way. Although rare, it is sometimes necessary to close school or delay the opening of school due to the unsafe weather conditions. In making the decision if schools should remain open or closed, first consideration is given to student and staff safety, while keeping in mind the importance of attendance and learning.

Before the school district makes the decision, local meteorologists, transportation officials, regional school districts, and traffic safety experts are consulted. The school district will attempt to make the decision as early as possible and communicate it quickly to the media and our website. Sometimes it will be possible to make the decision the night before, but often this decision cannot be made until early in the morning. The Student Transportation Department will be distributing the Alternate Emergency Snow Route Stops booklet to students who ride the bus. Please refer to this book when we announce through the media and our website that Portland Public Schools’ buses will be on snow routes.

In the rare event PPS calls a 2 hour late opening on a day your school has a scheduled late opening, school will start 2 hours later than your normal bell time – not 2 hours later than your late opening time. For example if your normal bell time is 8:00 AM, your scheduled late start time is 10:00 AM, and the district calls a 2 hour late opening due to inclement weather school will start at 10:00 AM.

As a general rule PPS will not close schools early. The chances of children arriving home early without parental supervision or the ability to gain entry clearly presents concerns when poor weather conditions are forecasted. All of our schools are capable of providing shelter in place until the end of the school day. As always, parents have the individual choice of picking up their child prior to the end of the school day.

Sometime in November the Snow Books will be distributed to students that ride school buses.

Local radio and television stations will broadcast closure and late opening information. You can also check for updates on the District’s website

at <http://www.pps.k12.or.us> or local media websites. Families will be notified via the Rapid Broadcast System. New this year, the district has set up a Twitter feed to relay closure, delay and emergency information at no cost. You may sign up to receive the free alerts at [www.twitter.com](http://www.twitter.com). Simply search PPSAlerts and click “follow”. If you don’t already have one, you will need to set up a Twitter account.
